A typical day for Glen

The day starts early in Vanuatu and I am a late riser at 6 am. The morning involves family breakfast and getting ready for the day's classes.

At 7:30 am I attend college devotions and then have classes from 8 am until 12 pm. I have three hours of classes each day, except Wednesday when we go into town to shop.

Family lunch is at 12 pm. Afterwards I open the bookshop until 1:30 pm and, whilst there, use this time for administration and email. The rest of the afternoon is spent preparing lessons and (soon) marking. Sometimes we enjoy a walk down to the river.

5 pm is time with Sophie, 6 pm family dinner, devotions and then bedtime for the girls.

The evenings vary: some are spent preparing classes, some in college activities, some just watching a movie or relaxing together, and sometimes students drop in.
